Every Sunday we hear a rich selection of Scripture readings at Mass. we believe that when the scriptures are proclaimed in the Church Jesus himself is really present, and speaking to us of himself.

We have the precious opportunity to open up to the Lord when he comes to speak to us, heart to heart. But it takes time for us to be ready for Jesus' personal communication of himself, and it really helps to prepare for our Sunday encounter with him.

So, I want to invite you to the quiet prayer group which runs after Thursday Mass twice a month. We gently and slowly allow the Sunday readings to speak to our hearts. The Lord reveals himself personally, individually, in periods of silence and times of sharing as we slowly absorb some of the Sunday scripture readings.

Leaflets from St Beuno's Jesuit retreat centre help us to pray together, and later at home, leading up to a deepened encounter with the Lord at the Sunday Mass.

The meetings, "preparing for Sunday Mass by praying with the readings" follow Mass on 2 Thursdays a month from 1pm until 215pm. The next meeting is this Thursday, 26th. Do come along!
