We celebrate this weekend the Feast of Christ the King, which marks the end of the liturgical year. Next weekend is the First Sunday of Advent, with all the hope and new beginnings of the Advent season. I often find that I'm quite prepared for the Lenten season, having thought and prayed carefully about how I might live the deeper prayer, fasting and almsgiving that we're invited to, but can come into Advent less prepared. Perhaps this week is an opportunity to pray about what the Lord is inviting us to do during this season. The First Sunday of Advent will mark the introduction of our new lectionary, with new translations of the Bible that we will pray with at Mass. Bishop Bosco has written a beautiful pastoral letter for this weekend, inviting us to use this as an opportunity to "renew our commitment to hearing God's voice in Scripture – not only during Mass but also in our daily lives." I always find Advent a great opportunity to renew and deepen my relationship with God's word. Our advent almsgiving opens our hearts more fully towards others, especially the weakest and most vulnerable. Last Wednesday was 'Red Wednesday' the day on which we are invited to pray for persecuted Christians. We offered Mass and had a holy hour for them. We will now be dedicating our Wednesday evening holy hour from 5-6pm each week to prayer for persecuted Christians. Copies of Aid to the Church in Need's report on persecuted and forgotten Christians are available from all our churches. They are an excellent charity to support. MPs are debating the assisted dying bill this coming Friday, 29 November. Please do write to our MP about this and join us as we pray very specially during our Friday adoration time for this intention. In this week's newsletter, Roddy writes powerfully about his taking our donations to the Open Door. Perhaps you might consider donating to the Foodbank or Open Door as part of your Lenten almsgiving.
