CONTACT US
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In this week's reading from the gospel Jesus is praying to the Father just before His crucifixion. He knows that His suffering is going to lead to God's glory and so speaks with confidence and obedience. Testifying that all he has done has come from the Father, Jesus now prays especially for His disciples who must remain in the world after their master has returned to His father in heaven. The close relationship between Jesus and His Father is highlighted in this extract from the gospel. It is built on love, trust and complete faithfulness - even in the face of terrible suffering.

We see clearly how the gospel this Sunday is related to our reading from the first letter of St. Peter. Believers are encouraged to rejoice when they share in Christ's sufferings. We are reminded not to be ashamed should we suffer for our faith; but, rather, we should glorify God in our trials. Jesus himself gives us great example in John's gospel in focusing on His destined completion of God's will, rather than on fear of its approaching and costly betrayal, suffering and death.

Suffering for God has meaning and purpose. Eternal life comes through knowing God and remaining faithful to him, as Jesus' prayer teaches us. Suffering as a Christian should bring us closer to Christ. Today's readings challenge us today to remain faithful even when our belief is tested. Glory is to be found not in comfort or success, but in trusting God and living courageously for our Master and our Father in Heaven – especially in difficult times.
